Supportive Services for Veteran Families

The Supportive Services for Veteran Families (SSVF) program promotes housing stability among very low-income Veteran families living in or transitioning to permanent housing.

Services We Provide

The SSVF program focuses on homelessness prevention and rapid re-housing for Veteran families. The program provides participants with the following services:

- Outreach
- Rapid Re-housing
- Eviction Prevention Assistance
- Personalized Case Management
- Permanent Housing Location and Assistance
- Housing-Related Counseling
- Assistance Receiving VA Benefits
- Employment and Training Services
- Temporary Rental and Move-in Assistance
- Links to Community Resources and Public Benefits

Program Eligibility Requirements

In order to receive services through SSVF, a person/family must be:

A **“Veteran family,”** defined as a single person or family in which either the head of the household or his/her spouse is a Veteran.
