Seven Hawthorne residents experiencing homelessness have finally been provided permanent housing. All people experiencing homelessness, some for over 10yrs, are recipients of a LACDA emergency section 8 voucher. These Hawthorne residents lived outdoors, in their car, park benches and freeway under paths. Having keys to their apartment and calling it home, provides a sense of safety instantly. They have been part of Hawthorne's Homeless Coordination Program since 2019. Special thanks to St. Margaret's Center for the non-perishable food items and Trinity Lutheran Church for welcome baskets filled with a pillow and comforter.
