### New One-Way Parking Zone Eases Congestion on 126th Street

The area around Hawthorne City Hall was getting too congested with traffic. To fix this problem, the city recently made 126th Street between Hawthorne Boulevard and Grevillea Avenue a one-way street just for parking. This change had two main goals: to create more parking spots for people visiting City Hall, and to reduce traffic jams caused by cars parked along the street. By adding these new parking zones, it's now easier for residents and visitors to access city services without dealing with as much traffic.

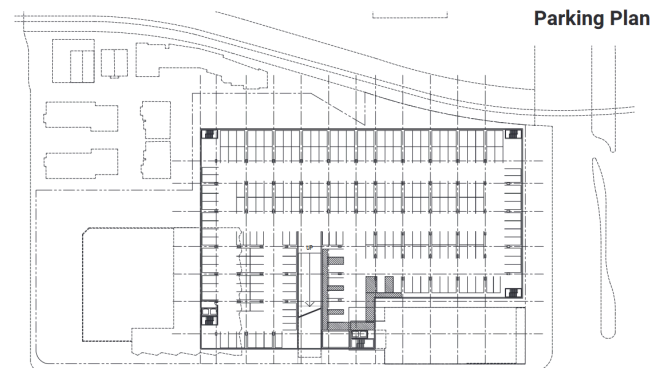
