The Artist Tree are known throughout California for their friendly and knowledgeable services, offering over 600 products in a beautifully designed store. **Cannabis Retail comes to Hawthorne** after 61% of the voters approved Measure CC in the November 2020 election, authorizing a 5% tax on gross receipts of cannabis business.

In this year's 2024 State of the City Address, Mayor Alex Vargas took the stage to address dignitaries of surrounding cities, as well as residents in Hawthorne. During his speech, Mayor Vargas talked about the problems that the city was conflicted with when he first got elected as Mayor in 2016 and how much it's improved thanks to the help of city staff.

Alongside the uncertainties the city was facing he also talked about how it's improved under his leadership. Some of the accomplishments he's mentioned was how the city's cash balance climbed up by 1850% since 2016, how the city has implemented cost-saving technologies in city operations by going paperless, maintaining established key public-private partnerships with organizations like the South Bay Workforce Investment Board and Los Angeles Dodgers, among other accomplishments.

At the end, he brought his fellow City Councilmembers and department head staff to thank them for their accomplishments.
